



To improve active transportation and prepare for future development in the Horseshoe Valley area, the Township is in the process of completing a 2.5m wide asphalt walkway along the east side of Line 4 North, from Highland Drive, to the entrance of Horseshoe Valley Memorial Park.

This project will be completed in two phases. The first phase which will be completed in 2021, is to construct an asphalt walkway from Highland Drive to the Huronia Nurse Practitioner Led Clinic. This phase will also include pavement markings and signage at Highland Drive/Line 4N to accommodate the new walkway.

The second phase of walkway construction will be undertaken as part of the County of Simcoe Horseshoe Valley Road Widening and Intersection Improvements project. This phase will connect the asphalt surface to the park and roundabout. Further connections will be made with construction of the new school/community centre which will see the primary access routed between the Huronia Nurse Practitioner Clinic and the Fire Hall (Station 3).

Until the County of Simcoe Horseshoe Valley Road Widening and Intersection Improvements project is complete, a temporary granular walkway has been installed to the entrance of Horseshoe Valley Memorial Park, to provide safe pedestrian access, while allowing connections to the future roundabout and new school/community centre site.
