Planning and Policy Context



Township of Oro-Medonte Official Plan

The Township of Oro-Medonte Official Plan (1995, as amended in 2020) describes the vision for the community. The vision recognizes:

- location and importance of the environmental features and natural resources
- rural character of the area
- socio-economic characteristics of the area
- needs of present and future residents

The Official Plan provides the basis for protecting the natural heritage system while managing growth that will support the Township's unique character, diversity, civic identity, rural lifestyle and cultural heritage features, and to do so in a way that has the greatest positive impact on the quality of life in Oro-Medonte.

Craighurst is identified as a *Rural Settlement Area*, and future growth within the area is anticipated.



Planning and Policy Context




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Craighurst Secondary Plan

The Oro-Medonte Official Plan identified the Craighurst Secondary Plan to provide the basis for the development of a diverse community area in a manner that has the greatest positive impact on the quality of life in Craighurst.

The Georgian Communities parcel of land is located in the northeast corner of the settlement area. The Secondary Plan identifies these areas as a designated Living Area, Community Use Area, and Environmental Protection Area.





Municipal Class EA Process

The Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (MCEA) process frames the planning and implementation of municipal infrastructure and is legislated by the *Ontario Environmental Assessment Act*. The process can be used for planning individual projects or to address groups of projects, through a Master Plan.

Master Plans are long range plans which integrate infrastructure for existing and future land use with environmental assessment principles. These plans outline a framework for planning for subsequent projects and/or developments. At a minimum, Master Plans address Phases 1 and 2 of the MCEA process.

Phase 1: Problem and Opportunity	 Review background planning and policy documents (e.g., Official Plan) Identify study area needs, problems and opportunities
Phase 2: Alternative Solutions	 Detailed inventories of socio-economic, natural and cultural environments Identify and evaluate feasible alternative solutions Select Recommended Alternative Solution Present to public and agencies for comment




Water, Wastewater & Transportation Master Plan

A Water, Wastewater and Transportation Master Plan was completed in December 2019 to identify a long-term municipal servicing plan for future development of the Craighurst and Horseshoe Valley settlement areas.

The plan provided direction on the preferred solutions for implementation of water, wastewater and transportation infrastructure to accommodate future growth within the two settlement areas.



Preferred Water & Wastewater Solutions



The Master Plan identified 3 projects relevant to the Craighurst Settlement Area that fall under the requirements of Schedule B Municipal Class Environmental Assessment projects:



Improve water supply wells to provide additional capacity

Construct a new in-ground water storage facility in the vicinity of the Craighurst well




Construct a new Wastewater Treatment Plant with sub-surface discharge in Craighurst


Georgian Communities is moving forward with the completion of the detailed design and construction of these projects on behalf of the Township of Oro-Medonte.

To date, the following studies have been completed:

- Functional Servicing & Stormwater Management Report
- Traffic Impact Study
- Planning Opinion Report
- Environmental Impact Study
- Preliminary Hydrogeological Study and Site Development Assessment
- Geotechnical Investigation
- Natural Hazards Assessment
- Floodplain Assessment and Hydrology Update



The following studies will be completed as part of the next phase of the project:

- Aquifer Test Plan: Craighurst Municipal Groundwater Supply Assessment
- Detailed design of Wastewater Treatment Plant
- Detailed design of a new Water Supply Well, Treatment and Distribution System
- Functional On-site Sewage System Design
- Stormwater Management Report
- Plan of Subdivision Detailed Design



Concerns & Part II Order Process

A request may be made to the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks for an order requiring a higher level of study, or that conditions be imposed, only on the grounds that the requested order may prevent, mitigate or remedy adverse impacts on constitutionally protected Aboriginal and treaty rights.

Requests should specify what kind of order is being requested, how an order may prevent, mitigate or remedy those potential adverse impacts, and any information in support of the statements in the request.
